Racial Justice

Continuing what God started in me

As I've confessed from the pulpit, Paul's Letter to the Philippians has a special place in my heart. So, it's not surprising that, as I began to write this article, two quotations from that epistle popped into my mind. First,

from chapter 1, verse 6: "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ (NRSV)." And second, from chapter 2, verses 12-13: "Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure (NRSV)."

I'm not exactly sure when issues of racial justice became a passion for me. I could point to incidents in my early childhood in the segregated South, in my later childhood in cosmopolitan London or in imperfectly integrated Kirkwood, to growing awareness in my university or seminary years. I can say that racial justice was a deep concern by the time of the birth of our second son in 1995, when we chose the name "Sean Martin" in part to honor the memory of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. I can't point to exactly when God began the work toward racial justice in me, but I am confident that God began that work and will "bring it to completion."

TRUSTEE REPORT

Parsonage updates

We are ready to consider renting our parsonage at 119 South Thomas. Jim Foster and I met with Terry Fischer, RE/MAX BEST CHOICE, who is the only person suggested as someone to handle the renting of our property. She toured our parsonage with us and will be suggesting what amount we might set for rental. We asked her for a copy of her contract and the fees she would expect to receive. The trustees will be meeting November 1 at 8 a.m. to move forward with the rental process.

After we gather all required information, we must call a Charge Conference. Our District Superintendent, Bruce Baxter has talked with Pastor Chris and said that Rev. Tisha Green, pastor at Festus United Methodist Church will officiate. Other requirements for this called Charge Conference are a 10 days notice prior to the meeting, a letter from the district superintendent, a letter from our pastor, a motion to rent the parsonage from the trustees and minutes and attendance from the charge conference. Copies of the lease template from the Missouri Conference have been given to the trustees for their consideration. The officers of the local church are required to be in attendance at the conference.

Of course, I'm also mindful of Paul's admonition to "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling." Because of the multicultural nature of our Baptist association in Washington State and of the City of Lynnwood, where I served as a City Council member and president, I was given ample opportunities to pursue training and real life experience in multicultural ministry and anti-racism, including training with the Kaleidoscope Institute, close work with the Black Caucus of the Evergreen Association of American Baptist Churches, the

formation of Lynnwood's Taskforce on Police Relations with Communities of Color, and the institution of two "daughter" congregations at Good Shepherd Baptist Church, known as Lynnwood International Fellowship (immigrants from Africa and Asia) and Iglesia Bautista el Buen Pastor (Latina/ o immigrants). The pandemic slowed down those last two programs, but they continue to grow and gain steam.

DeSoto, of course, is overwhelmingly Euro-American (White), so I didn't expect much opportunity to exercise my ministry in this regard through St. Andrew's. But I'm delighted to say that the Missouri Annual Conference is starting training for a group of pastors and lay leaders to become "Culture Coaches," and I have been selected for this training! I will be in Columbia for initial training on November 3 & 4.

Beyond that, I cannot say yet what time will be required but Conference personnel have assured me that coaching assignments will not interfere with my work for you.

I am feeling doubly blessed by the warm reception Connie and I have received at St. Andrew's and by this new opportunity to follow what God has put in my heart. Thank you for all the ways you continue to support me.

Pray without ceasing: Pray in the shower, in your car, on the beach, on your lunch break, at a stop light, in a grocery line. God hears all your prayers. Pray nonstop.

Rejoice always: Look for everyday celebrations every day. Do you have hot water? A car? Clean socks? food? Friends? Rejoice.

For a disciplined approach, keep a journal of your daily thanks, or a "gratitude list" that you can pray over and revise. Keep it up and it's a good bet that your developing "attitude of gratitude" will result in you becoming more generous and seeing the world through a lens of abundance.
